Acclaimed Singer Storm Large Returns to Newly Reopened Carpenter Center For Two Nights of Sultry and Subversive Cabaret

Storm Large is the first artist this season to kick off performances on the Center's intimate Cabaret Stage

LONG BEACH, California — The Richard and Karen Carpenter Performing Arts Center, located on the campus of California State University, Long Beach (CSULB), welcomes vocalist extraordinaire Storm Large back to the Carpenter Center's Cabaret Stage for two evenings of dazzling music and song, Wednesday and Thursday, November 10th and 11th, at 7pm.

Storm Large made a name for herself as a singer with Pink Martini, and for her riveting 2006 performance as a finalist on *Rock Star: Supernova* and her multiple appearances this year on *America's Got Talent*. Storm has sung with the National Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and performed with Grammy winner k.d. lang, singer/songwriter Rufus Wainwright, and Rock & Roll Hall of Famer George Clinton. *The New York Times* calls her "sensational."

In her appearances on November 10th and 11th, Storm Large entralls with her interpretations of the American Songbook and Broadway showstoppers. Audiences share the Cabaret Stage with Storm and her band on both nights, allowing the emotional immediacy of Storm's presence and voice to reach every seat. This performance marks the first cabaret show at the Carpenter Center in 19 months, and the last chance for audiences in Southern California to witness Storm Large in concert this year.
